The regular semi-monthly meeting of the village council was held in the council chamber on Tuesday evening, 13th inst. Reeve in the chair, members all present.

Minutes of last meeting read and confirmed. Moved by C. S. Smith, seconded by Wm. Inwood, that leave be granted to introduce a by-law to regulate the proceedings of this council and that the by-law be now read a first time.—Carried.

Moved by D. Henderson, seconded by John Kennedy, that leave be granted to introduce a by-law to punish vagrants and other disorderly persons and respecting public morals, said by-law to be now read a first time.—Carried.

The report of the village auditors was presented and referred to the Committee on Finance. The special committee appointed to examine the petition respecting ringing of town bell at 6 o'clock each morning presented a report stating that their investigation was not completed and that a further report would be presented at next meeting.

The by-law to regulate the proceedings of the council was read a second time and laid over for further consideration. The by-law to punish vagrants and other disorderly persons, and respecting public morals was read the second and third times and passed.

Upon motion the council adjourned.
