Immigration This Season.

Prospects are growing brighter every day, say officials of the Department of Agriculture, for an unprecedented immigration, mainly for Manitoba and the North West, the ensuing summer. It is to be assumed that fit preparations will be completed for their reception and disposal early in the season, for the subsequent volume of the influx must depend to some extent upon the reports made by the first arrivals regarding their treatment.

Interesting To Farmers.

A gentleman considerably interested in agricultural pursuits and who has large intercourse with the farmers of this vicinity, has suggested to us the propriety of introducing the subject of opening a cheese factory in Acton or some central point in the neighborhood. We believe the question is one deserving of consideration on the part of the farmers in this section, and one which could be brought to a successful issue by the expenditure of very little capital. In many other parts of the country cheese factories are in successful operation, and there is consequently no good reason why one cannot be made to pay here. By the opening of a cheese factory the farmers would get a good price for their milk and be free from the trouble of converting it into butter; also, if they invest in the stock of the company they will realize their share of the profits arising from the monthly sales of cheese. A dozen farmers can form themselves into a company, and an investment of \$75 or \$100 cash will provide all the capital necessary for building and machinery. We would recommend our farmer friends to give this matter a little careful deliberation.

The New Banking Act.

By an Act just passed by the Dominion Government private bankers are no longer allowed the privilege of using any name in connection with their institution which would lead the public to believe that in dealing with them they were dealing with chartered banks. The clause in the new Banking Act prohibiting the use of misleading names, such as "banking association," "banking company," etc., was the object of considerable discussion and opposition in the House, but it was eventually carried. There is not the slightest doubt that the importance and convenience of private banking institutions is great, especially to the business men in places where there is no chartered bank; but these financial firms should make their usefulness felt under a correct designation. The innocent public in the majority of cases transact business with these private banking companies under the impression that full security is given for the funds entrusted to their keeping. It is right here, however, that the public are deceived, for no security is given by these "Banking Companies," as is done in regular chartered banks. In introducing this clause in the Banking Act against the use of deceptive names for private enterprises, we have no doubt the government only had in view the interests of the people.

Another Industry For Acton

Acton is in a fair way for being favored with another industry of considerable importance. Messrs. Beard & Moore & Co., Toronto, who own the large stone quarry on Main street in this village, which is about to be vacated by Mr. Chas. Kneer, are considering the advisability of resuming operations here on their own account. Acton has its advantages and also its disadvantages for this business. Its points of preference are, its excellent facilities for shipping, and its proximity to Toronto, which is the centre of the above firm's operations; and its principal drawback is the scarcity of hemlock bark. However, the firm is at present negotiating for favorable terms with the railway authorities for delivering bark here, and in all probability the business will be settled in Acton, provided the consideration required of the municipality is granted.

It is the intention of the Messrs. Beard & Moore to transact a much larger business than formerly, and they will consequently employ a more extensive staff of workmen. The present building

ings are at present in a very bad state of repair and if the firm decide to open the tannery they propose expending \$6000 or \$7000 on improvements to buildings, machinery, &c., and this in itself would give a number of our mechanics a good season's work.

All the firm asks from our corporation in consideration of starting the business here, is exemption of the tannery property from taxation for a term of years. To this proposal we do not expect any citizen will object, but that all will see that it is to their personal interests to have the above business situated in the village, and we trust that the council will grant the exemption required, and use their influence to induce Messrs. Beard & Moore & Co. to situate their business here.
