## ACTON'S EXHIBITION.

A Complete Success in Every Respect.

#### LARGE LIST OF ENTRIES

Double the Number of Visitors Ever Hith erto Present at an Esquesing Exhibition

The event which has been one of interest to our citizens during the past month or so, terminated with the proceedings of yesterday, and the exhibition of the Esquesing Agricultural Society-for 1883, held in Acton on the 3rd October, will long be remembered as far surpassing any show of the Society up to this date. The weather was bright and cheerful, but rather cold and windy to be pleasant outside. This, however, did not hinder visitors from being present, and the attendance was something enormous for a township show, there being something over 3,000 people on the grounds. The entries figure much higher than any previous exhibition of the society, and numbered a little over 1,000. The show both inside and out was excellent, and far surpassed the anticipations of the most sanguine. The exhibit of horses was equal to the majority of the County fairs and numbered over 200 entries. In cattle a fine show was made, while in sheep, pigs and poultry the number shown was largely in excess of usual years, in fact the whole show of live stock was most satisfactory. The exhibit inside was all that could be desired. The array of ladies' work and fine arts commanded the admiration of all, gists. both for extent of exhibits and excellence of the work shown. In butter, such a collection was never before seen in the township, there being about eighty entries. The show of grain, roots and regetables, was very good, while the exhibit of fruit was comparatively poor, and was about the only department feebly represented. The canvas tent for the inside show, although as large as the building generally used by the Society, proved altogether inadequate for the number of exhibits and the visitors desirous of viewing them yesterday. However, a suitable building will no doubt be erected for future exhibitions of the so ciety. The grounds could not be surpass ed. There was ample room for everything, and the horse ring could not be excelled for size or condition. The show is over: everybody seems satisfied, and the officers 50 cents. Sold by J. E.
