. "The Esquesing township fair was held last Wednesday at Acton. The attendance was very good, though not as large as might have been had it been held in some more central spot. It proved as great a success. however, as could reasonably be expected of one held at an extreme corner of the township."

A perusal of the above paragraph would cause any person who visited the fair at Acton to conclude that the editor of the Nece knew nothing whatever about the Esquesing show of 1883. The insinuation that the attendance was not so large as if the fair had been held in Georgetown, is certainly without foundation, as the gate money shows that the attendance was more than a 1000 higher than that of any previous exhibition of the society. The number of exhibits too, was larger than on any previous year.
