Sunday Parades, and Prohibition Pamphlet.

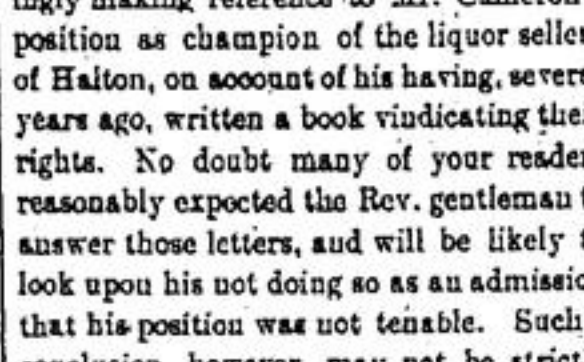
