PNEUMONIA

Many a strong, well-built man leaves homo-to-day, before night he will have a chill, and in a few hours he will be dead!

Dr. Darnoch, the famous musician, is seized by a chill while conducting rehearsal; next day his physicians tell he is dying.

Dr. J. E. Lattin, D.D., S.T.D., Dean of Boston University, theological school, catches a chill one morning, has a slight chillness thereafter, feels unwell for a few days, and unexpectedly dies.

A celebrated New York physician told the Tribune, a year ago, that pneumonia was a secondary disorder, the exposure and cold being simply the agent which develops the disease, already dormant in the system.

Nearly 150 of the 740 deaths in New York city the first week in March and in six weeks 781 deaths were caused by pneumonia.

The disease is very obstinate, and if the accompanying kidney disorder is very far advanced, recovery is impossible.

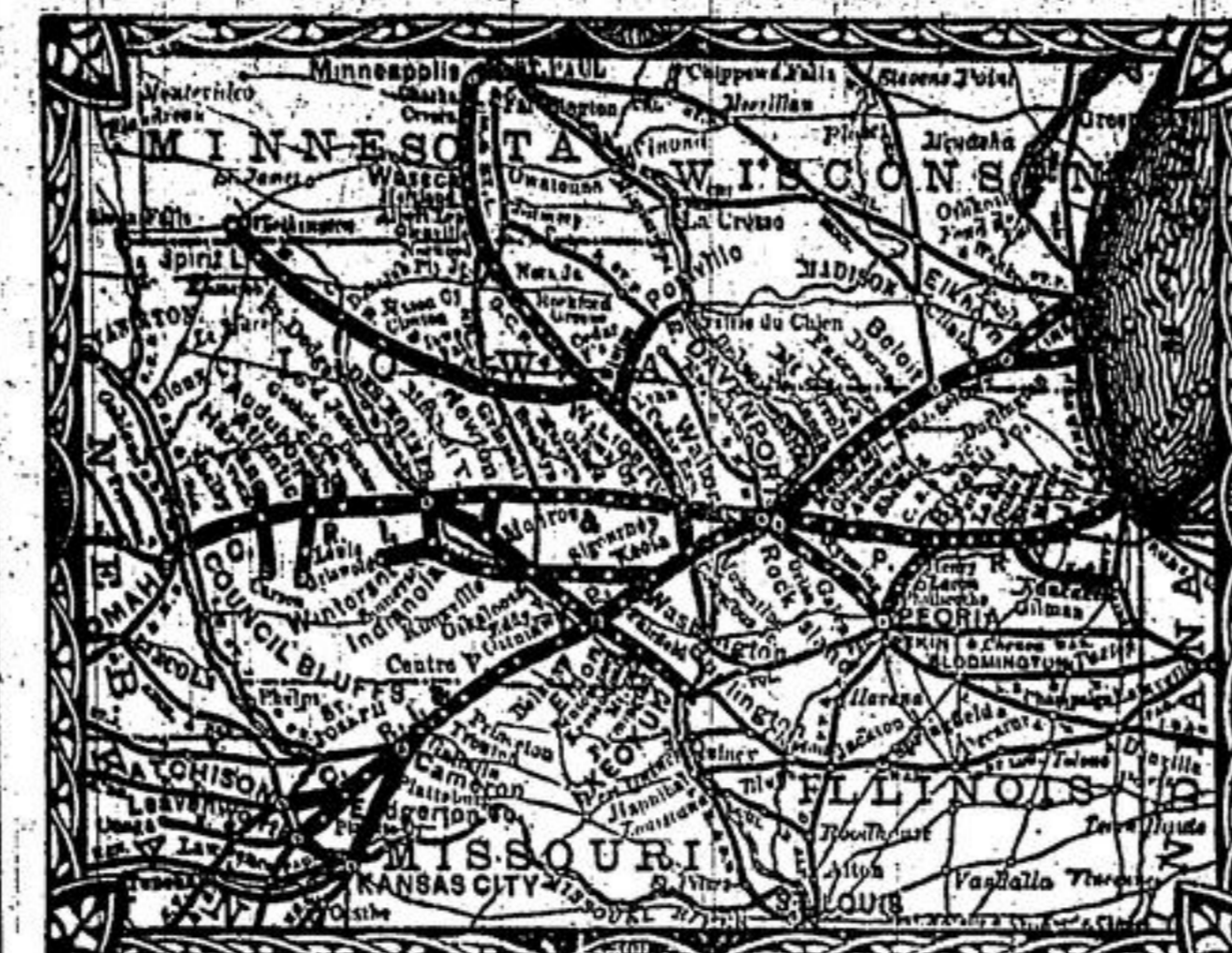

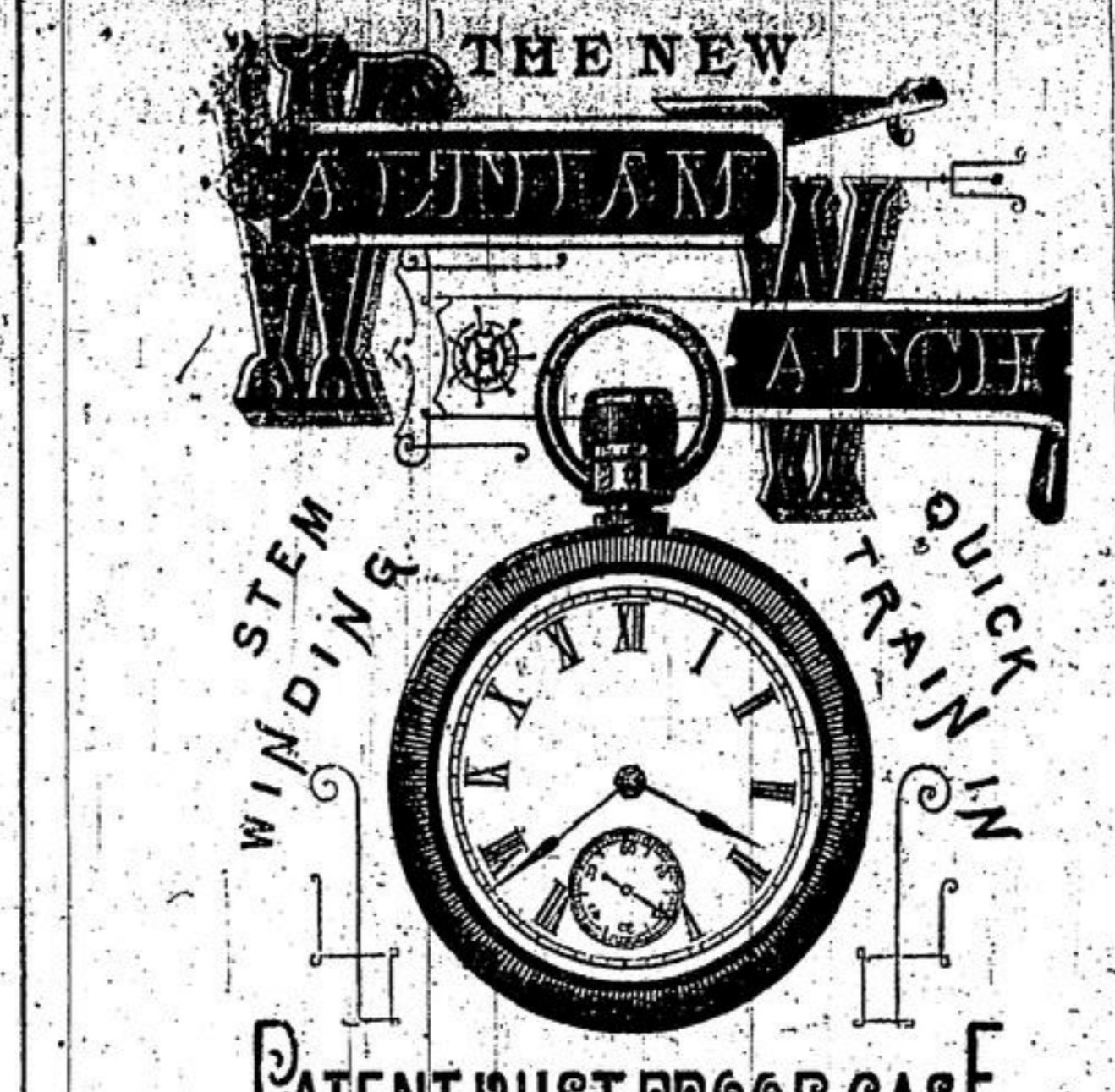
