A Large Attendance; A Fairly Successful Show, but Room for Improvement.

The annual fall fair held at Georgetown last Friday was, taken altogether, a very good one, and the attendance quite satisfactory. The weather was fine and bright, but rather cool for comfort out of doors, and as usual it was about half past three before the judges had completed their labors in the hall, and of course visitors were locked out until that hour.

The entries numbered over a 1,000—a hundred or so less than last year—and although there were very few entries in some classes, competition was unusually keen in others. There is withal that lack of enthusiasm which would be seen were the show to be held alternately in Georgetown and Acton, and it is very easy to see that it needs Acton to give it such another boom as was accomplished on each of the three occasions when it was held here.

The judges were carefully selected and we believe performed their duties to the best of their judgment, and in all cases conscientiously. The duties of the judges in Ladies' Work and Fine Arts would be very greatly facilitated were the directors to arrange all the entries for each class by themselves and designate the class with a card or number. For years the mass of exhibits in these departments have been hung together in every kind of confusion, and half the time of the judges is necessarily spent in ferreting out the several entries in each class for comparison.
