THE PRICES FOR WHEAT.
The season's crop is harvested, the grain is threshed and in the bins, the returns in most cases below the average, prices continue low and the question rises in the farmer's mind, is it better for me to sell or to wait over until spring in hope of better prices. The wheat crop of America is below the average this season and many look on this account for an advance in price, but it is very probable that with the extended wheat areas in the east which pour their annual products into the European markets, the deficiency in the west will be more than counterbalanced and the price kept as low as they stand at the present. Indeed it has been stated on the best authority in grain circles that the whole of the American wheat contribution to the British markets might be withheld for two years without materially raising the price, so great are the available products of opening fields, particularly in India on the slopes of the Himalaya mountains. It will be of advantage to our farmers to sell their grain at once, and this avoids all risk of fire, etc., and the natural shrinkage from one cause and another will knock.

DEATH OF SENATOR SEWELL
MONTREAL, Oct. 11.—Hon. L. A. Sewell, President of the Richelieu and Ontario Navigation Company, died shortly after 4 o'clock this afternoon. A few weeks ago he had a stroke of paralysis and has never recovered. He was born at Veranois, Que., July 10, 1829, and has sat in both Quebec and Dominion Parliaments, being made a Senator last spring. He was also President of the Montreal Street Railway Company. He has constructed several railways in the province.

SIR CHARLES TUPPER UNSEATED
HALLOW, Oct. 10.—The election court met at Hallow to-day. Judge McDonald presided. The petitioner, Mr. Piper, and Sir Charles Tupper were both present in court. Mr. O'Connell, the petitioner, stated that he had received a notice admitting his bribery by agents of the respondent. Mr. Townsend, for respondent, then made the same admission in open court. Judge McDonald as once gave judgment that the election of Sir Charles Tupper was null and void and that the vote in the case be declared by the respondent. The prohibition party in Cumberland has called a convention at Hallow for the 18th to nominate a candidate in the coming election.
