NOTES AND ANNOUNCEMENTS.

The Salary Committee of the Toronto City Council will recommend that the salary of the Mayor be in future \$1,000 instead of \$800.

The Mayor, however, should not say that Candidate Henderson is "unpopular" among the Conservatives. It will be very sad when the next candidate is beaten by an unpopularity man.

Mr. McLeod, Master in Ordinary, or Sometime, announced that the directors of the Central Bank would be called upon to explain the loss of more than \$60,000 reported profits between October last and November 1st.

During the month of December last the amount deposited in the Government savings bank was \$31,000. The amount withdrawn during the same period was \$80,000, thus making a balance of \$41,000 on savings bank deposits during the month.

There can now be no doubt that the Grand Trunk Railway has joined fully up the Northam and Northwestern Railway lines. The changes in the directorate of the Hamilton and Northwestern company, made this week, sets the long-vexed question at rest. The complete transfer of the road right over the Grand Trunk line is believed.

Over two hundred persons and many thousands of their dependents in the recent blizzard of the 18th and 19th, Milbank, Wis., cousin and wife, Dr. May Barnes and others became the unfortunate victims of the severe cold and setting in the more favored parts of the Canadian North West before the winter's first snowfall.

The number of bodies of the passengers General Mills, it is believed, will be found in a few days. It is believed that the net revenue for the last year, ending the 20th June, will be \$100,000, or more, against \$2,000,000 of insurance taken out. Bracewell, Jan. 21.—Shortly after five o'clock this morning, the Prestress Manufacturing printing office was entirely destroyed by fire, everything being lost. The building owned by the proprietor, was uninsured, as was also the power plant. The insurance on other material was only \$750, a fourth of the total loss. Much indignation and excitement has been created by the fire, the universal opinion being that it was of incendiary origin, in short, an anti-Scott Act outrage. The County Tribune, of which the Gazette was printed at the office, and the junior editor was secretary of the County Alliance and lately a special constable, the editor's house had a narrow escape.

Bracewell, Jan. 21.—The office of Israel Evans, License Inspector, was shattered dynamite at one o'clock this morning. No one was hurt, but the house is badly damaged. He had a loaded revolver under his pillow, and fuse and caps for dynamite cartridges were under the clothes at the foot of the bed. Three others are detained on suspicion, but it is thought they are innocent.
