NOTES AND COMMENTS.

Fifty-nine county jails in the State are empty. Prohibition tells.

The Dominion Department of Customs has decided, on the advice of the Minister of Justice, not to proceed with the appeal in the celebrated Ayer case.

Chicago has set other cities an example in the regard of putting the telegraph and telephone wires underground. In the business district of Chicago not a wire is to be seen, although there are something like five thousand miles of wire beneath the surface, and all are working to everybody's satisfaction.

Shearman has a high assessment, but a very low rate. The rate for this year is only 12 mills. How much more favorable this appears to the outside world than our rate of 35 mills. Shearman's rates are nevertheless just as high as "Ayer's," considering the value of the properties assessed, but of course it looks that way.

Complaint having been made to Washington that Canadians are employed on United States Government works on the frontier, Judge Chipman has introduced a bill proposing that no one shall contract or labour on public works who has not declared his intention of becoming a citizen, and who is not an actual resident of the United States.

If any readers of the Free Press receive letters from friends in the south, find them marked with two rows of small holes, dozen in each; punched in the envelopes, they may be curious to know the significance of the marks. The holes indicate that yellow fever was raging in the district where the letter was posted and that the letters have been disinfected by the Post Office authorities.

A circular has been issued by the Department of Education stating, in effect, that all who, at the recent third-class non-professional examinations, obtained a total of six hundred marks or over, should be allowed to write for second class non-professional certificates at next examination, and further, that all who wrote for seconds will not be required to obtain thirds before competing for seconds.

The collapse of Hays & Co., furniture manufacturers of Ottawa, is another proof of the folly of granting bonuses to manufacturing establishments. Just one year ago Messrs. Hays & Co. obtained from the town of Ottawa a bonus of \$16,000. Now the concern is bankrupt, and owing \$12,000 on the debts to creditors. The business which is profitable does not require any bonus, and that which does not pay can not be kept alive by taxation upon the municipality or province. Moreover the granting of subsidies to factories destroys that spirit of self-reliance and ambition in the individual which is a prime factor in securing the success of any enterprise.

OUR COMING EXHIBITION.
All Arrangements Complete.—A Most Successful Show of the Weather & Proprieties on the 9th and 10th.

During the past week the directors, the citizens' committee, the carpenters and the prospective exhibitors have been busily engaged in furthering arrangements calculated to ensure the success of the Union Exhibition to be held in Acton, on the 9th and 10th inst.

The extension and addition to the exhibition building have been completed and make the building more than double its former size. This will give ample space for the increased number of entries anticipated, and the internal arrangements are now being perfected with a view to exhibiting everything presented to the very best advantage.

Unusual attractions are arranged for. A lacrosse match will be one of the items of interest for the afternoon. On the evening of the first day the hall and grounds will be brilliantly illuminated with Chinese lanterns, besides which the interior of the hall will be decorated with evergreens, bunting and miniature stage. The proceedings will be enlivened with music by Acton Cornet Band, which very creditably defeated Halton Battalion Band of Georgetown, with its paid Bandmaster, at Esqueme Fair last week. The doings of the evening will be fittingly concluded with a magnificent display of fireworks.

Only four days now remain before the Exhibition opens. Let everyone interested therefore, complete their list of exhibits and make their entries with the secretary at once. The indications are that the number of entries will reach well up to two thousand and this means a very busy time for the Secretary. Our townspeople and those in the immediate neighborhood at least should remember this and act upon it so as to avoid over-crowding of work when exhibitors from a distance require attention.

ESQUISSE FALL FAIR.

The Exhibition Held Last Week the Most Successful ever held in Guelph or Georgetown.

NUMEROUS ENTHUSIASM.—LARGE ATTENDANCE.

The annual exhibition of Esqueme Agricultural Society held at Georgetown last Thursday and Friday was the best ever held in that village. The weather was fine, the exhibits excellent and the attendance large. The entries numbered some 1600, considerably larger than the usual number, but of course not quite up to last year when the show was held in Acton, and 1890 entries were made. Some disadvantage was experienced in having the inside exhibits in the drill shed several blocks away from the new Exhibition Park, recently purchased by the Corporation. However this defect will probably be remedied by next fall as we understand a building is to be erected for the purpose there.

The appearance in the drill shed was much more attractive than usual; more space having been secured by the erection of a gallery along one side and end. For the most part the classes were well represented. The display of ladies' work and fine arts was really excellent, as were also those of fruit and vegetables.

The officers of the society faithfully performed their duties, and the Farns Park representative is indebted to Mr. Lachlan Grant, the outgoing secretary, as well as to Mr. R. D. Warren, of the Herald for courtesy extended.
