NOTES AND COMMENTS.
The amount received by the Dominion Government for license issued to American fishermen in the waters of the Atlantic coast is \$5,000, or double the amount received during the whole of last year.

The English papers announce that Lord Dufferin leaves home shortly on a leave of absence extending over several months. It is said he will resume his duties as British Ambassador at the Italian Court until the autumn.

Postmaster-General Workman is reported as saying that he has heretofore overestimated the importance and urgency of a reduction of letter postage to one cent, but that he has gone to contemplate that better rather than cheaper postage service should be the first concern.

The revising officer in receipt of notice that the revision of the Dominion voters' list is to be begun as early as June as practicable. The office of clerk has been abolished, and any assistance required must be paid for by the revising officer out of his allowance.

Now that the Census Act is in force again, it will be well to bear in mind that buyers as well as sellers of intoxicating liquors are liable to be fined for drinking in taverns during prohibited hours, namely, between seven o'clock on Saturday evening and six o'clock on Monday morning.

In Byrneson and other portions of Middlesex a sufficient number of signatures have been obtained to present any license being granted in the immediate vicinity. The people who worked hard for the repeal of the Scott Act, expecting to get licenses as they are to be very much disgraced.

The Manitoba Government has attended the location of the proposed public buildings. The Reformatory will be located at Brandon, the Deaf and Dumb Institute at Portage la Prairie, and the House for Invalids at Winnipeg. A large tract of land will be purchased for the Reformatory site.

OUR CAPITAL LETTER.
The Joint Question—Death of Senator Ryan—French School in Ontario—The Voters' List—The Speaker.
NOTES AND COMMENTS.
From several correspondents.
Ottawa, May 28.—The Jewish agitation has struck the Capital for the third time in two months. There is now no sort of question as to its import and intensity no matter what opinion there may be as to its expediency. The longer the agitation continues the greater the force, and the little opposition to it among the religious bodies only brings out the strength of the major party. Prominent observers here agree that the movement is growing and coming electoral struggles will be very complicated.

At a meeting on Thursday the 25th of the Ottawa Methodist district representing twenty churches a resolution was passed against the action of Parliament in refusing to allow the disallowance of the Jewish Act was moved. A debate sprang up as to whether the Government ever lacks a defender. Rev. W. W. Carson, Rev. Mr. Scott and two laymen opposed the resolution but the twenty-six other delegates carried it and great is the resentment of the city Methodists against the dissenters.

Last night a mass meeting was held in the opera house at which the Act was denounced by Principal McVicar of Montreal, Rev. High Johnston of Toronto, and half a dozen Ottawa clergymen. Where will it all end! Here we have such fathers of the Presbyterian church as Principal Carson and Dr. McVicar not to speak of a younger but equally respected pastor, Mr. D. J. Macdonnell, actually stamping the Province against both political parties. Mr. Macdonnell has spoken in Hamilton, Toronto, and Peterboro so far. The highest officials of the Methodist church are out on the same platform. Will the few follow the palpit to the pole? The Jewish agitation is a new hook on which many hang their general Protestant belief in "Romish aggression"—there's the rub.

DEATH OF THE OLDEST SENATOR.
Senator Ryan of Montreal, died there Saturday morning in his eighty-fifth year. He was the oldest member of the Senate of Canada and a Conservative. He was prominent in commercial circles, having been a director of the Bank of Montreal. There are four vacancies in the Senate.

FRENCH SCHOOLS IN EASTERN ONTARIO.
A return prepared at Mr. Craig's request by the Ontario department of education shows that there are out of a total of 8,400 schools 176 in which English is not the only language taught. Sixty-five of these are in Prescott and Russell, thirty in Essex, five in Kent, four in Simcoe, three in Renfrew (two French and one German), one in Guelph and two in Carleton. The remainder of the 176 two language schools are German. In Russell and Prescott 4,225 pupils are taught both languages. In some of these schools it is reported "French is the language of instruction. Some of the teachers cannot teach English at all.

RETURN TO THE VOTERS' LIST.
At least instructions have been issued to proceed with the revision of the electoral lists and copies of the lists have been sent to revising officers. They are to be sold for three cents a page to interested parties. Attention is drawn to the fact that there is no longer any legal authority for advertising in the newspapers. The inference is that the authority must now come from the Secretary of State. It is safe to say that the agents of both political parties will now look alive as the fight at the general elections begins here.

MR. SPEAKER.
Member Ontario in the French minority address him, completed his forty-first year on the 30th inst. L. Col. Olmest, M.P. for Laval belongs to one of the oldest families in the district of Montreal. As commander of the 6th Batt. served in the Northwest campaign and next year voted against the Government on the Riel question. He had shown his independence of action before by supporting a motion of Mr. Blake's in 1887 for commercial independence and it is safe to say that Mr. Speaker Olmest favors the independence of Canada as nearly every prominent French Canadian does. Mr. Olmest is said to be the sixth child of his parents and if so the oldest still to determine as it increased for the speaker is a tall, broad shouldered man with a massive head. He makes a dignified presiding officer and in that respect is not less popular than his predecessors.

THE 23rd being the seventh anniversary of Hon. John Coit's entrance into the Cabinet the minister of inland revenue received numerous addresses. The Fisheries department has already received \$6,000 from American fishing schooners for licenses to fish under the modern coveys.
Sir John Macdonald will in September unveil the statue to be erected at Port Hope to the memory of the late Col. Williams, M.P.
The Governor General has gone to his summer fishing resort on the Cascapedia. His Excellency in passing through Quebec gave \$500 to the victims of the St. Saverre fire.

The Government is being urged to prohibit the extension of the Ontario Central Ry. from Hastings county to Sandbury through a valuable mining and lumber country.
Mr. Anderson has arrived here from England to confer with Mr. Foster concerning the proposed new fast line of mail steamers on the Atlantic.
A Post of the Grand Army of the Republic U.S.A. has been organized here at headquarters for all Canadians who fought for the North in the American war. There are about 3000 veterans in Canada and branch Posts will be established. Major Chapman of Ottawa is eligible for membership.
Last night Ottawa appointed delegates to the anti-French Convention to be held at Toronto, June 10th and 11th.
SENIATOR RYAN DEAD.
One of the Oldest Members of the Canadian Parliament Passes Away.
MONTREAL, May 28.—Hon. Thos. Ryan, Senator for the Victoria division of this province, died this morning, after a somewhat long illness, at his residence in this city.
Mr. Ryan was one of the oldest members of the Canadian Parliament. Thirty years ago he had won a foremost position in maritime affairs as a member of the firm of Ryan Brothers & Co., of Montreal and Quebec. He retired on a competence in 1863, in which year he was elected to the Legislative Council of the old Province of Canada for Victoria.

A CASE OF MANSLAUGHTER.

On Monday morning, May 18th, Atkinson with a friend named William Coxon, of Toronto, came to the creek to fish and they selected a spot just below the dam at Glenora, where spotted trout are numerous. The creek at this point runs through the farm of Daniel Markie, and he shortly time ago gave his son-in-law, James Scott, the right to collect a fee of 25 cents from those fishing on his property.

Henry Atkinson, the accused is one of the best known residents of Mono Township, and was at the last municipal election a candidate for Deputy Reeve. He is a man of about 30 years of age, and is about 58 years of age and is very tall and muscular.
THE RYANSON STALE UNRAILED.
The Stale to the memory of Dr. Egeon Ryerson, the founder of the Public School system in Canada, and the General Superintendent for so many years, was unveiled on Friday. In the front of the Normal School, Toronto, which was the name of much of his labor, there now stands a bronze likeness of the man to whom Ontario owes a lasting debt of gratitude for having established what is perhaps the greatest school system in the world. The height of the bronze figure is 9 feet 6 inches, and of the pedestal 10 feet 6 inches. The statue was a gift from the Ontario Education Department from Queen Street east. Dr. Ryerson is represented in the pose of addressing the Legislature in behalf of popular education, his right arm and leg being advanced, his lips slightly apart, and his face having the animation arising from the consciousness of pleading for a just cause. In his left hand he holds a book, and behind him stands a pedestal on which are the school laws of the Province. The total cost of the statue was \$6,176. On the front of the pedestal is the inscription:—"Ernest Ryerson, Founder of the School System for Ontario," while on the back is recorded:—"Born in Charlotteville, County of Norfolk, Ontario, March 21, 1818. Died at Toronto February 10, 1882."
