THE TRIAL OF THE HALTON ADJUSTED.

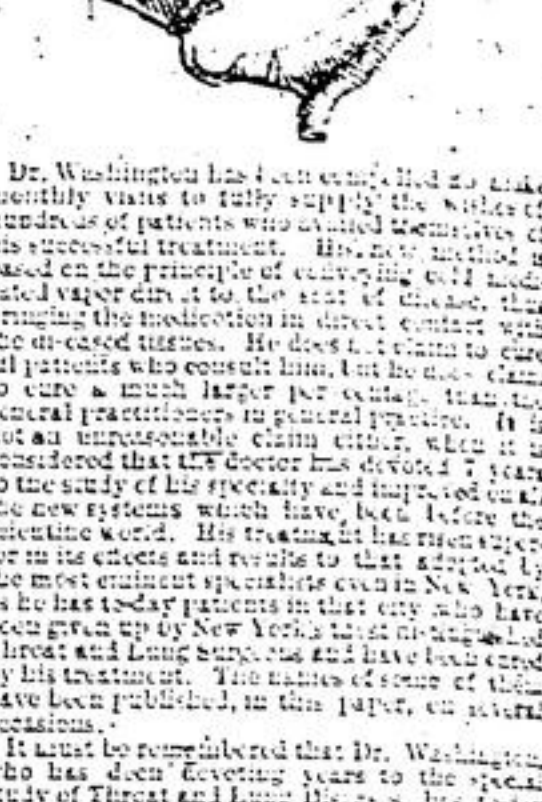
