During the late strike on the New York. Central Railroad, the militia were ordered to be in readiness in case of a riot, but they were not called out. In an interview, Gov. Hill said the

troops were not to be called upon except in case of an emergency. The emergency had not risen, therefore they would not be ordered out. He remarked that this was the first great strike with which he had had experience, and he did not propose to lose his head; the only point at which there had been serious trouble was at Syracuse. and there a deputy-sheriff had lost his head and precipitated an encounter.
