The Tammany machine comprises the body of men which rules the city of New York as absolutely as the King of Sism rules his kingdom. 'Popular governments in any just sense has for the present ceased in this city. The Tammany General Committee is composed of 4562 paying members, and they pay annually ten dollars each into the treasury. But of this number only 2567 are allowed to vote at the meetings. The total number of rumsellers is Gel, of persons not in the city directory and of no occupation, 1606, in all 2287. That is; more than one-half are either rumsellers or persons without visible means of support or known residence, while of the rumsellers nearly six-sevenths are criminal or habitual violators of the law. 


When we consider the many weary hours spent in sewing, and the amount of thought that is given to each garment, we feel very much surprised that more attention is not paid to the quality of the material selected. Some in their eagerness to buy cheap, (which almost always means a lower grade of goods at a lower price.) seem to forget the great amount of labor that will be put into the garment before it is finished, in many cases bringing it up to almost three times the cost of the material.

For example, take two ladies buying a dress, one goes to a store which is called cheap, because they handle only an inferior line of goods which were_intended to be showy; but never to wear, and pays say 20c. per yard. Her neighbor, who deals where only reliable goods are handled; pays say 5c. per yard more. After the dresses are bought, the same thought and labor will be given to each, and when finished there is only a triding difference in the coat of the dresses, but one will wear almost half as long again as the other. New if this were all the difference, it would be quite sufficient to convince any thoughtful person of the folly of purchasing so called cheap goods, but it is not all. The difference in appearance is as marked as the difference in the wear. When on the street one will be noted as having a stylish appearance, while the other will never have anything but a shoddy look, and yet the one cost but 1.5 more than the other. And the same principle applies to any other material as well.
