A COSSACK DRILL.
 The governor of Moscow recently invited some Russian journalists to witness a drill given by a regiment of Cossacks of the Don and he in the description which one of the writers gives of the wonderful performance of the cavalry of the czar.

"The drill of the Cossacks is something marvellous. We came to witness it just at the moment when the squadrons rode up at full gallop in front of the squadrons in line in the squares of a regiment never appear before but without saluting their officers and prearranging the following words:

"Good morning, my fine fellows!"

To this salutation the entire regiment responds—

"We wish your lordship good health."
 The troops then kneel and the manoeuvring begins. It was simply astounding. Imagine the most extravagant equestrian performance of a circus, enlivened by the most extraordinary variations, every one doing his bit in the equestrian art.

All this was displayed before us for two long hours by a thousand men in a tempest of dust and movement sufficient to make the coolest head dizzy.

"We saw horses bounding like panthers and men jumping like apes. We saw cavalrymen leaping, with their rifles, across their backs and their sabres in their hands, changing with flying strides upon their saddles.

Others would pass at full speed beside Cossacks stretched upon the ground, pick them up in their pockets and then dash to the front. One of the officers of the regiment, during this drill, was killed by a bullet in the chest. He fell from his saddle and lay motionless upon the ground. The drill was continued until the Cossacks were tired and the officers were exhausted. The drill was a grand and magnificent performance, and we were all in good luck to witness it.

HOW TO PRESS FLOWERS.
 One who has been in the woods, taking along one of those long-tapered sticks, with a forked end, or a light basket, have a layer of damp moss or your soap, and put your plants as you pick them. Choose the choicest specimens—and several of each sort will not do amiss; Gather the choicest leaves of the trees, sprigs of moss and any plants which you may wish to retain their beauty after being dried, and especially keep a lookout for ferns. Some plants are very small, and it is best to dig them up by the roots—it will be the most interesting to have the whole plant. It will be prudent to take along a book with you, which can be tightly strapped together, in your "press" to press some of the most delicate flowers immediately. Have covers perforated with large holes to admit the air. You can buy all sorts of botanical presses; but a couple of tin boards, you can readily make yourself, will answer every purpose. Put two or three sheets of dry paper between the covers, and tuck a couple of strips of leather so as to form a convenient handle. Be very careful in laying your specimens between the leaves to have every leaf separate and smooth.

After some plants have been in the woods you will find that your "press" will have a lot of plants ready for you to press. To preserve the delicate color of the latter it is necessary that they should be dried at once. Place them on your drying-paper and carefully arrange every flower; smooth out all the wrinkles. If any petals have been broken, you may mix with a little blotting paper.

Some flowers cannot bear the touch of a warm hand, and these you will find dried by being surrounded by blotting paper, and being turned water, and being turned away over a warm part of the wall. If you are in a hurry, you may use a press of the wild flowers and place in a vase of water, where they will straighten in a few hours.

After arranging your specimens on the drying paper, lay several sheets over and under them and put in a press or under a heavy weight. You will never regret the few dollars invested in a press. Twelve hours after pressing, change the paper, and press again. In a few days your plants will be ready to lay away. To keep your larger flowers until perfectly dry, keep under a weight until perfectly dry, and then lay away.

THE MILDEN SHORT.
