NOTES AND COMMENTS.

Mr. A. W. B. M. P. is King to be in Waterloo for the purpose of Agriculture and Immigration. His qualifications are such that he is a man who is to some extent up to date in the work, and who is familiar with the wants of the Northwest.

A conference will be held in Toronto on Friday next under the auspices of the "Provincial" A. S. Association of Ontario. The object of the conference is to further the cause of prison reform, and especially to consider the best means of giving practical effect to the recommendations of the Prison Commission, which are of the greatest importance, in the direction of reducing causes of crime to a minimum.

In his address given at Guelph, Scotland, last week, Lord Hartington, speaking for himself and the Liberal Unionists generally, said that if a majority of the Scottish people favored the establishment of the Scottish Church he would support such a movement. The significance of this statement has created surprise, it having been supposed that the Government was opposed to the establishment in Scotland.

John McDonald, the Toronto laborer, who is cited as a candidate for the honors of the children of the district, caused, as alleged, by garbage dumped by the city in a ravine not far from his house, has won the case and been awarded \$345 damages. The judge, in summing up, said that he would not be doing his duty if he did not express his indignation at the negligence of the city in depositing that decaying matter in such a public place.

Some time ago the Massey Co. of Toronto, amalgamated with Harris, Spence & Co. of Brantford, and more recently a similar arrangement was entered into by the Patterson & Bro. Co. of Woodstock, and the Winner Co. of Brantford, all implement manufacturers. It is announced that the four firms have now become one company. It will thus be seen that the implement industry of the country will be practically controlled by the firm. Whether it will be advantageous or otherwise to the farmer remains to be seen.

The Earl of Aberdeen's British Columbia land purchase was a large one. It consisted of 11,000 acres, the price being \$1,100,000. The land is situated in the Coldstream valley, and stretches for within a mile of Vernon for about 40 miles, and is believed to be one of the most valuable possessions in British Columbia. It is the Earl's intention to break up his large tract into small holdings, so that he will settle sturdy young Scotch farmers. This is practical work for Canada.

The proportion of travellers killed in railroad accidents in France from 1875 to 1890 was one to every 21,000,000 of passengers, and one wounded to every 1,000,000. In England, for the same term, one to every 21,000,000 of passengers was killed and one to every 600,000 was wounded; on the German railroads accidents are more frequent, although the number of travellers is less, one to every 9,000,000 of passengers was killed in England, between the years 1861 and 1900, one to every 6,500,000 was killed, and one to every 700,000 passengers was wounded; in the United States there was one to every 1,600,000 killed and one to every 41,000 injured.

On Saturday the Postmaster-General approved intelligence that the Jamaica authorities had accented to the proposition for a direct parcel post between Canada and Jamaica proposed by one Government. The limit of weight will be seven pounds, and the rate per pound, 37 cents. The new service will go into effect immediately. The limit of weight of parcels between Canada and Newfoundland, and also for parcels exchanged with other countries via Great Britain, has been increased to seven pounds. An amended table of rates adapted to the present limit of weight has been prepared for the guidance of postmasters.

Official returns show that to date a quantity than 157,000 pounds of opium for refining purposes was imported into Canada during the last fiscal year. This is a new industry, which the Government does not want any credit. In fact the quantity imported one way only 82,000 pounds. This opium can be refined in Canada free from any excise duty or supervision. The extent to which the opium habit has grown in Canada during the last few years is said by officials who should know to be alarming. The United States imposes an internal revenue tax of \$10 a pound on the refined article, so that a similar excise duty levied in Canada would produce a revenue of nearly a million dollars a year.

Russian securities are tumbling, and as vast amounts are held in France and Germany the collapse affects the money markets in those countries, which are themselves somewhat perplexed by short harvests. Most of the English newspapers look forward to another period of universal depression. The cost and drain of the Russian European armaments, the immense sums lost in the Panama Canal, and the French copper syndicate and in the Argentine Republic and now the partial failure of the crops throughout Europe with actual famine in Russia, are telling severely upon the trade and finances of the Old World. The British trade returns show a marked falling off, and many leading lines of industry are on the down grade.

The Canadian Apple trade with Great Britain this season is far in advance of that of any previous year. The total quantity of barrels of apples received in Liverpool from Canada and the United States up to November 7 amounted to 212,600 barrels, as against 62,000 barrels to the same date last year. In spite of the enormous increase, prices in ninety nine cases out of a hundred have been remunerative to the shippers. Canadian apples, owing to their superior keeping quality and fine appearance, are most in favor with the buyers. In the English market Canadian apples are preferred to any others. They not only keep better in transit, but they are more luscious in taste. All apples are sold in Liverpool by auction with amending receipts. On Wednesday last some 30,000 barrels were disposed of at 12 to 14 shillings per barrel for ordinary varieties, and 17 to 19 shillings for King's
