This is strongly confirmed by the statistics of temperance life insurance companies. The United Kingdom Temperance and Provident Institution, London, has been in existence 25 years, and J. J. Ridge, M.D., gives the following summary of the work: "The 15th return is as follows: Temperance section, expected claims, \$14; actual claims, 225. General section, expected claims, \$87; actual claims, 889. This shows 71.6 per cent. in the temperance section, and 160.2 per cent. in the general, a difference of 88.6 per cent. in favor of the abstainers. This is a little higher than the averages of the whole 25 years, which are 96.7 per cent. respectively, a difference of 26.7 per cent."

"In God we Trust."

The motto, "In God We Trust," which was stamped upon all gold and silver coins of the United States, was suggested by an old farmer living in Maryland. This conscientious Christian gentleman thought that our currency should indicate in some way the Christian character of our nation, which he argued, could not be done by putting a motto upon our coinage expressing a national reliance on divine support to governmental affairs. It was in 1861, when S. P. Chase was secretary of the treasury that this man wrote to Washington respecting his pet idea. His letter was referred to Mint Inspector Peck, who discussed it with General George C. Scott, the Postmaster General.

Pollock and Chase were in favor of introducing the motto at once, but congress gave the suggestion no attention whatever.

In his next annual report General Pollock

referred to the matter, this time in firm theological argument, saying, "The motto suggested, 'God Our Trust,' is taken from our national hymn, 'The Star Spangled Banner,' the emblem of our nation, to every citizen in the country; the motto is appropriate; 'tis an honor of national position."

Let us earnestly acknowledge God's

strength, and let our colleague declare our trust in God."

Two cent bronze pieces was authorized

by congress to be coined the following year

and on April 22, 1864, the first United

States coin was stamped with the legend,

"In God We Trust."—St. Louis Republic.
