NOTES AND COMMENTS.

June 2d has been fixed as the date of the dissolution of the English Parliament. A special despatch says the Liberals regard the election of this date as a political dodge to get an advantage by preventing borough elections being held on Saturday.

The Boston Post compares Boston and Nova Scotia as follows—Nova Scotia has a property valuation of \$200,000,000 and her imports and exports average about \$10,000,000 each per year, of which \$9,000,000 are exports and imports to and from the United States. The annual catch of Nova Scotia's fisheries amounts to between \$4,000,000 and \$7,000,000, principally in cod, herring and mackerel, which finds a market all the way from Montreal to the West Indies. All this great commerce and useful wealth, too, is represented by a population scarcely larger than that of Boston itself.

The Manitoba Government has just issued its crop bulletin, which shows the acreage in Manitoba, exclusive of the Northwest, to be as follows: Wheat, 87,500 acres, 332,774; barley, 97,644; peas, 2,184; potatoes, 10,003; roots, 17,494. The acreage of wheat has slightly fallen off this year. This may be accounted for by the winter setting in early and the farmers neglecting their ploughing to attend to their threshing. Correspondents report the wheat as being healthy and vigorous, and all speak encouragingly of the prospect of a good crop. Harley shows an increase of nearly 8,000 acres, of 30,000 acres, peas, 500; rye, 400; and corn, 1,000. The farmers of Manitoba are beginning to appreciate the value of fax, and this year 2,000 acres under crop. The area planted this year of roots is nearly double.

The following general directions to tract officers have been issued by the Education Department of Ontario—Each officer shall endeavor to procure the attendance at school of all children in the district assigned to him, between 8 and 14 years visiting them at their homes or places of employment, or looking after them in the streets for this purpose, and shall, by written notice to their guardian, and by other means, if necessary, see that the child is not sent to school in a district assigned to him, to procure the attendance at school of any child who is a habitual truant, or who is required by the provisions of the law to attend school, it shall be the duty of such officer, after notice as required by the Act, to procure a warrant and arrest such child, who shall be brought before a magistrate having jurisdiction in the case.

The great church courts, Presbyterian, Methodist, Congregational and Baptist are all in session this month, and one and all have tackled the temperance question with remarkable aggressiveness. He does not need to be a teetotaller to discover through the clarified atmosphere of these meetings, the rapid approach of a serious political crisis. It is all very well to speak at resolutions, but resolutions help to make and intensify sentiment and convictions, which will in turn burst out in a conflagration of righteous indignation that will destroy the bad traffic in drink and sweep the party politicians who block the way to reform. The men who gather in these annual meetings and solemnly demand the overthrow of the liquor traffic, we must remember, are the representatives not only of the best, but of the mass of people of Canada, and they are not exceeded in ability or patriotism by those who assemble in the Commons Chamber in Ottawa—Royal Temperance.

The Price of Blinded Twine.

Wholesale dealers have received the price list of binder twine for this season from the Consumers' Cordage Company. The price last year was lower than the previous season, and the quotations this year are 10 to 15% lower than were last season. This was hardly expected after the deal which brought the various cordage mills in Canada under the control of one concern, and that we have the same somewhat singular case of a combine reducing prices. There has not been much inquiry for binder twine, but there will probably be a good demand for it in a couple of weeks.

County Court and General Session.

The above Courts were held last week at the Court House, Milton. His Honor Judge Kingmiller presiding. The civil docket contained only one case and the criminal docket two cases for larceny and one for appropriating goods. The case of the Queen vs. Beauchamp was tried and resulted in the conviction of the prisoner. It will be remembered that Beauchamp stole \$60 last December from the residence of Mr. Fisher of Burlington. The arrest was cleverly made by County Constable Springstead, of Stoney Creek, and Beauchamp was convicted on purely circumstantial evidence.

Queen vs. Fisher.—Was an indictment for stealing a logging chain from Mr. Samuel Agnew, of Niagara Falls. There was not being sufficient evidence given on behalf of the Crown the judge discharged Forces with the case going to the jury.
