NOTES AND COMMENTS.

Owing to the drought in the United Kingdom, a scarcity of hay crop is predicted. The cereal crops have also suffered, and a greater demand for Canadian barley will be the result.
It is unfortunate in the extreme that the decision to keep this year of the Acton Fair closed on Sunday, having been accepted in good faith by the world, should have been reconsidered after the Fair had been actually inaugurated.
The usual list of titles bestowed on fortunate commoers, in honor of Her Majesty's birthday, includes several Canadians. Senator Carling has been made a Knight of the Grand Cross of St. Michael and St. George, while Chief Justice Strong was also treated a Knight.
In the Presbyterian General Assembly of the United States the appeal of the prosecution against the action of the Acton Fair, upholding Dr. Briggs, was sustained and the report of the committee suspending him from the ministry has been adopted.
Mr. Waters' bill to amend the Ontario Assessment Act by taxing income and not personal property, has been withdrawn until next session. In the meantime copies of it will be sent to every municipality in the province that is interested, and that a report of the municipality's views on it be forwarded to the Government.
At the conference between the representatives of Canada and Newfoundland at Halifax it was agreed to reduce the rate of postage between the two countries to three cents per ounce, or in other words, to apply the domestic postal rate of either country to the other. Hereafter the letter rate has been five cents per half ounce. It has been arranged that the change mentioned shall take effect on the first Dominion day. It involves the free transmission of newspapers between the two countries.
Judging from the increase in butter factories this season in the provinces of Ontario and Quebec, the production of creamery butter will be the largest on record, and it therefore follows that producers will have to find a larger export outlet, which can only be done by following the English market and selling on an export basis precisely as cheese exporters do. Butter is certainly a more perishable article than cheese, yet, strange to say, makers as a rule, speculate more on the former by holding than on the latter.—Trade Bulletin.

JUNE MEETING.

Annual Convention of the Disciples of Christ in Ontario.
The annual convention of the Disciples of Christ opened Thursday afternoon at 8 o'clock. Mr. Hugh Black, President, presided over the opening devotional services, after which the minutes of the last session of the convention of 1892 were read by J. W. Kilgour and were confirmed.
The following committees were then appointed:—Order of Business—G. Munro, P. Baker and W. Towell. Enrollment—G. Munro and C. P. Mackay.

At the evening session, C. Sinclair addressed the meeting on the subject, "The atonement."
A large number of representatives of the churches in Ontario were present Friday morning. Devotional exercises were conducted by A. McKinnon. After the reading of the minutes, the President addressed the meeting. He reviewed the work of the past session, and then turned to the subject of the convention met in Erieport, Mich. progress has been made during these years. During the year aid was given to the churches in Toronto (Colt street), Toronto Junction, Welland, Collingwood, Hamilton, London, Owen Sound, and other places.
The report of the official board showed that during the year progress had been made in all departments of church work. The finances were affected slightly by the general financial depression.
J. H. Macdonald read a paper, "The Relation of the Y. P. S. C. E. to the Church," in which he pleaded the Society in the same relation as the Sabbath School. He considers it one of the strongest influences at work in the churches towards Christianization.

Mr. J. Ledford, of Owen Sound, delivered an address on "Our Duty as a People on the Question of Christian Union."
The committee on Times and Place recommended that the invitation of the delegates from the church in Ridgeway be provisionally accepted.—Adopted.
The final report of the committee on enrollment shows a representation of 161 from the churches.
The committee on obituaries reported the death of Bro. James Kilgour.
All the meetings have been well attended. The building which will hold about 600 has been filled to the doors each day, and on Sunday morning and evening the crowd was so great that Rev. Mr. Moffat, of Cleveland, preached to an audience outside the church as there was no room inside the building, while the committee room was recently built and is supposed to accommodate about 150, had to be thrown open to the congregation.
