An extra of the *Official Gazette* was published in London, Tuesday, notifying all British subjects of the existence of a war between Great Britain and Japan, and declaring Great Britain's neutrality.

Last week instructions were sent from Ottawa to the revising officers throughout the Dominion about making up the voters lists. By the short cut which was passed at the close of the late session the revision is to commence on the 1st August, and conclude on the 1st October.

A despatch from St. Petersburg states that the eight Russian warships that are about to sail from Vladivostok have a large number of troops on board. The destination of the expedition is not divulged, but it is quite plain that "summer cruises" will not explain the demonstration.

It appears that a better feeling between Germany and France is developing. It has been stimulated by events connected with the assassination of Carnot. It is possible that the two nations will again become friends and that the wounds caused by the war and the loss of Alsace and Lorraine will be healed.

It is remarked that the general health of the American people has improved with the advent of "hard times." The explanation offered is that "when money came easy" to people they lived too high, they ate too much and spent more money for drink and tobacco than they ought.
