NOTES AND COMMENTS.

The Dominion revenue for the four months ending October 31st is less by \$1,007,000 than for the corresponding period of 1890. The expenditure has increased over \$400,000.

Argument was begun on Saturday at Ottawa in the appeal case taken on the part of the Dominion from the finding of the Court of Arbitration, ceded with the settlement of the disputed outstanding accounts between the Dominion and the Provinces of Ontario and Quebec.

Premier Turner submitted the budget statement to the Victoria Parliament at Melbourne last week. The deficit is now \$1,000,000, which, with the previous deficit, makes a total of \$2,000,000. The Government proposes to establish a national debt committee on the English model.

The writ for election in London rendered necessary by the elevation of Mr. W. H. Mervin to the bench, has been issued. The nomination was held on Tuesday and the polling will take place on November 20th. The candidates are Mr. T. S. Hobbs, Liberal and Mayor Essex; Conservative.

Ohio has just paid \$245,000 for the services of the State Militia during last summer's big strike. Chicago has yet to do so, with a bill for \$100,000 having been introduced to several million. A little common sense and a desire on the part of the local officials to enforce the laws instead of playing to the mob would have been much more economical.

In Manitoba if nine jurors agree, such agreement constitutes a verdict. In Ontario unanimity of the twelve jurymen is insisted upon. The Manitoba plan certainly could never be possible for one or two weak-minded, "rankly" prejudiced, or possibly dishonest men, to thwart the purpose of a long and costly trial.

The English Liberals have finally decided to adopt the abolition of the vote power of the House of Lords as the first plank of their party platform and will go to the electors with it on the next appeal to the country. Without this power to veto the House of Lords will be powerless for good or ill. It will, however, be some time before the Lords is lost.

At the late assizes at Kingston, before Judge Armour, a man who had been thrown from a buggy, as the result of a collision with a cow on a rural highway, brought action to recover damages against the township. The plaintiff was nonsuited, the judge holding that the municipality was not liable, but the owner of the cow was. Farmers will do well, in view of this declaration, to keep their cattle at home.

While doubts are expressed by those who are friendly to China, in her war with Japan, as to the authenticity of the Japanese reports of their successes, and especially as to the capture of Port Arthur, China, etc., reported, is so far discredited by the failure of her troops to resist the advance of the Japanese, as to have signified her readiness to acknowledge the independence of Corea, and to have appealed to the European powers to put an end to the war.

A despatch from Montreal says - New Haven and Quebec capitalists are in the city in the interests of the scheme to build a railway line from Quebec to the Labrador coast. A short time ago it was reported that railway men from the other side were negotiating for the purchase of some of the short lines running out of Quebec for the purpose of extending the system to the coast and establishing line connections with the lines of the Grand Trunk, Boston, and Liverpool. By this means it was said that the ocean passage could be reduced to three and a half days. A surveying party is being organized to go over the proposed route, and report on the scheme.

During the last two months there has been a good demand for Canadian eggs in England, at prices which have warranted shipments being made either on a small scale, or on a large scale, to meet the demand from London. Canadians have met a profitable market there, as well as in Liverpool, Manchester, Bristol, and Glasgow. Although there was scarcely any demand for eggs in Great Britain at anything like profitable figures, a vast change has since set in for the better, as the receipt of Canadian eggs in Great Britain for last September, according to the Trade Bulletin, were 497,620 dozen, against 230,600 dozen for the corresponding month last year, being an increase of over 100 per cent.

Mr. George W. Bishop, ex-city treasurer of Terrebonne, Wash., has been arrested, charged with embezzling \$2,136.
