GREAT FIRE IN TORONTO.

The Globe Office and Various Other
Buildings and Contents
in Ashes.

Toronto, Jan. 8.—Toronto had a fire
Saturday morning which was the most disastrous
that the city has ever known. The destruction of property will amount to
nearly three quarters of a million dollars,
spread over a dozen business establishments,
and a great number of insurance companies. But more serious than the destruction to property, one fireman was killed and four others seriously injured.

The loss of life and property was as follows:

Robert Bowery, killed.
Chief Arndt, injured.
Silas Simonds, injured.
Robert Foster, injured.
Frank Forsyth, injured.
Estimated loss, \$750,000.
Estimated insurance, \$400,000.

The fire started in the *Globe* newspaper building, at the corner of Yonge and Melinda streets. It was discovered by the night watchman a few minutes before the alarm, which was raised by the fire chief. The building, which had been regular up to the time of the fire, was completely destroyed, and the building which housed the other businesses was met by a cloud of incendiary smoke. He rang the fire alarm as quickly as he could, but the flames made such rapid headway that by the time the fire bells began to arrive the building was fast paving. A thick smoke was falling, deadening theattle of the bells and dulling the sound of the alarm bells so that comparatively few people even in the town down district knew anything about the beginning of the battle which would presently threaten to include within its sweep a large area of the business portion of the city.
