The grand total of pupils attending
High, Public, Separate and Model Schools
in the Province of Ontario in 1894 was
104,159, in 1872, 10,000; in 1877, 50,000;
in 1882, 144,919; in 1887, 511,071, in 1890,
399,777; in 1893, 565,410. These were
used for educational purposes in 1894,
\$2,299,033, in 1877, \$3,567,181, and in
1893, \$5,232,115.

Mr. Justice Kilian gave judgement at
Winnipeg Monday in the matter of a by
law passed by the Municipality of Louise
prohibiting the sale of intoxicating liquors.

The judgment was given in the interest of

the public health, and an order was made that it be quashed
without costs. This is in accordance with
a recent decision of the Supreme Court,

and some ten municipalities in Manitoba
are affected.

The report of the Department of Inter-
gestion for the Province has been brought
down. As compared with 1893 there was
a decrease of 600, and with 1892, of
1,000. The number of deaths from alcohol
was settled to this Province during 1894,
the total number being 5,666. These num-
bers include only immigrants for this pro-
vince who hand at the ports of Halifax,
Quebec and Montreal.

The revenue and expenditure statement

of the Dominion for the month of March
shows the revenue to be \$2,740,153 and the
expenditure \$1,669,038.

A bill has been introduced in the Senate

to prohibit the sale of intoxicating liquors

in the city of Ottawa.

The committee on finance presented their

third report, April 4, to the House for
approving auditor's annual statement.

Moved by T. H. Hardinge, seconded by H.

Swackhamer, that the Finance report be
adopted. Carried.
