NOTES AND COMMENTS.

A wealthy Birmingham man, who made most of his fortune manufacturing idols for the people in India to use in worship, is going to give a handsome sum of money, after his death, to help the missionaries in India make war against idol worship.

The number of sheep inspected for shipment at Montreal to the end of June was 18,790; cattle, 20,820, of which 16,400 were stockers for export to France. The number of horses was 4,110 and the number of swine 124,123 were sent forward in charge of these animals.

The Sunday street car agitation in Winnipeg received a rather sudden quietus by the action of the Legislature during the late session. It made the running of Sunday street cars in the province illegal. This will settle the question for a considerable time to come in the prairie towns.

Spain has just been borrowed by the British government at the lowest rate of interest on a government transaction. The government asked for \$6,000,000 to repay some Treasury bills. The lenders accepted a \$50,000,000 and the lowest price which was accepted fixed the interest at a trifle under sixteen-sixteenths of one per cent.

Spain has decided to pay the claim of \$1,500,000 proffered by the United States on account of the seizure twenty five years ago of the Cuban estate, of a naturalized American citizen. The Washington Government will not halt this decision with pleasure. The payment of the money will deprive the big Republic of an excuse for armed interference in behalf of the Cuban rebels.

The woman suffragist of Kansas in convention assembled, have adopted a resolution that as the men of that State refused female suffrage, "it is the duty of every self-respecting woman in Kansas to fold her hands and refuse to help any moral, religious, charitable, reform or political association," until the men repent. This is a bold move. But have the Kansas ladies tried holding the baby with folded hands?

An English Parliamentary Commission has recently reported against the suppression of the opium traffic in India. The cause, or explanation, sounds familiar to Americans: The revenue is needed. The pity, the shame of it! The two great Christian nations of the earth in a subtle, insidious, unprovoked, and deliberate, killing their own people for revenue—a plea as hypocritical as it is murderous. Nashville Advertiser.

Those who have been paying \$100 and upwards for bicycles will be interested in the opinion of a New York industrial and mechanical expert that the wheels can be probably retailed at less than \$50. That as a matter of fact, it costs less than \$20 to make the very best of them now, and that by this time next year \$30 will be the common retail price for a first class wheel. Like typewriters and sewing machines, bicycles have long been sold at inflated prices.

The British Electricians are in full swing and will continue for several weeks yet. While nothing definite can be concluded it is quite evident that the Liberals are suffering severe defeat, and the Unionists are gaining ground. Sir William Harcourt was defeated in Derby but has since been offered a seat in the House. Up to Tuesday night the returns showed that the Unionists have 231 seats, Liberals 45, Anti-Parnellites 13, Parnellites 4, net Unionist gain 21.

The first report of British crops for the season, shows that the wheat average is some 30 per cent. smaller than in 1904. The drought has seriously damaged all the food crops. Wheat and oats made an even lower percentage of conditions than in the dry season of 1903, wheat being three per cent. and oats 4 per cent. worse. Taking 100 as the normal, the following figures represent the present condition of the different crops: Wheat, 79; barley, 81; oats, 76; beans, 77; peas, 79; potatoes, 81; roots and grass, 68; hops, 53.

There is a rebellion in Macedonia, an insurrection is going on in Cuba, a conflict between French and Brazilian citizens has taken place on the frontier of French Guiana. Bulgaria is preparing to average a raid into her territory by Turkish irregulars. A French expedition is engaged in an attempt to conquer Madagascar, and in three months, well informed officials believe, Home and Japan will be at war. The year of universal peace is not yet in sight, notwithstanding the modern inventions which have made war so terribly destructive of human life.
