NOTES AND COMMENTS.

The partner of the late Hon. W. D. Balfour, J. A. Auld, was elected to represent his constituency, South East, on Tuesday, by a majority of over a thousand.

The Government has been advised that the Canadian route is to be utilized by the Imperial authorities for the new parcel post between England and Japan. This is quite a profitable compliment to Canadian enterprise.

The proposed tariff inquiry will begin about Nov. 10, and will be conducted by Sir Richard Cartwright, Hon. Mr. Fielding and Hon. Mr. Peterson. Arrangements have been made to visit Montreal, Toronto, Hamilton, London, Quebec, St. John and Halifax.

In referring editorially to Canada's importance as a mining centre, the World on Saturday ventures this prediction:—Canada is destined to be one of the wealthiest countries in the world, and the bulk of our wealth is yet undiscovered. Just now our enterprising men are getting in the thin end of the wedge. From the time we do well, we will have the ore both in British Columbia and in Ontario. All we need is confidence on the part of our capitalists and we in this country are on the high road to wealth and prosperity. Our ship is already in sight.

The same danger threatens the minor municipalities of Halton county, as will be seen by the vigorous protest from last week's Acton Free Press.

The Dominion Finance Department has closed the books for the last fiscal year. The revenue totals \$36,617,485 and the expenditure \$36,980,000, a net deficit of \$363,481. In previous years the net deficit was \$4,070,332. The total expenditure on account of the war up to Sept. 30, was \$25,529,204. The amount expended up to Sept. 30 shows the revenue to be \$4,616,206 and the expenditure \$4,602,350. The revenue is thus increased by about a quarter of a million while the expenditure is decreased \$95,000.

The statement of the business of the Post Office Savings Bank is a record of steady growth in the branch of the public service. The balance of savings in the banks on July 1st was \$55, an increase of \$4 in the year. On July 1st, 1886, the number was \$22. The total amount deposited last year was \$136,947, while the withdrawals amounted to \$74,066,000. The total number of accounts remaining open on July 1st was 126,452. The total amount standing to the credit of depositors was \$26,032,059, the average of each account being \$208. The cost of managing this branch of the service was \$58,310, the average cost of each transaction, that is, withdrawals or deposits, being 2c.

The Burlington Record made its first comment on the new County Council division in last issue. It says:—There should be no difficulty for Nasagaway to secure one of these councillors, while Milton or Acton will send the other one, and whichever town is unsuccessful will have to be without a representative in the County Council for two years. This is an injustice to any community of the size and importance of Milton or Acton. It is in a measure their own fault. We understand that at the sitting of the committee in Milton there was no representative present to present a plea for Acton. It is true that Acton was not officially represented at the meeting of the commissioners, but is that any reason why two sedate judges should be parties to a manifest injustice such as has been inflicted? Have our public affairs come to such a pass that we must be satisfied with the ground to watch proceedings there which is to be done because he concluded that a decision made by men on the ground and accepted by the County Council as a whole at a meeting where this was the principal question under discussion would be adopted by the commissioners who were entirely ignorant of the county and its interests?
