SHOOTING BACTERIA FROM

One of the latest and most singular experiments with bacteria is that of a German investigator, Mossner, who has proved that those microscopic enemies to human life and health can be fired out of a gun without suffering any apparent injury, He has infected rifle bullets with bacteria and then fired the bullets into tin boxes






