Use plenty of advertising space to tell your story well and thoroughly, but tell it simply. Don't whoop. Don't turn verbal flip-flaps. Don't make n jumping jack of the English language. Don't tear your hair and froth

at the mouth. Just get down to business and tell people, in short, simple words, all about your news store and your new goods. 'Act like a solid business man, not like a fly-by-night fakir. The man who merely jumps up and down might just as well stand still. "Soft and fair goes far in a day."

Work up a good solid business by solid business methods. Coax, and wheedle and suggest, and argue-don't try to yank trade in by the hair. As Bill Nye once sagely observed: "When you want to kiss a girl, don't grab for it. Take your time-it's

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
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
