These men and their families bought only enough food and clothing, and that of the poorest kind, to eke out a miserable existence Had they spent this vast sum for those articles needed in their homes does anyone doubt what would have resulted? They, themselves, would have been much happier, better citizene, better parents, while the money would have given employment to hundreds of thousands and brought prosperity to all except those engaged in the damnable business of making and selling

Why, theu, should not every manufacturer, every merchant, every producer, be interested-in-the-liquor issue? - Can they not see that the use of liquor impoverishes their customers and prevents them from purchasing their goods? They should unite to protect their customers from the ravages of this monster if from no other reason than that of self-protection.

The prohibition of the liquor traffic would result in an era of prosperity unknown to this generation. We all want prosperity, but we are not willing to adopt a sensible, practical method to seenre it! We generally admit the ovils of liquor selling and liquor drinking, but seem unwilling to apply the remedy. We want to sell our goods and grain, but we are not yet roady to assist our customers in spending their money for articles of necessity and comfort. We know the people can't est their cake and keep it too. Yet we act as though they could spend their money for liquor and at the same time buy our products.

Consumers are impoverished largely by the liquor traffic. This traffic takes their money and leaves little for legitimate. business. Let the farmers, manufacturers: and merchants got down to business and combine against this common enemy of mankind, this vampire which sucks the life-blood from the people. Close up the saloons and see how quickly the mills and the factories will begin to call for more men and greatly increase their production. Ontlaw the liquor traffic and secure asober people and you will have a prosperous people. And prosperous consumers means prosperous manufacturers and merchants. -Ohicago Lever.






