GERMAN TREATY BROKEN

Great Britain Again Act in Canada's Interests.
LONDON, Eng., July 30.—The commercial treaty between Great Britain and the German Zollverein, which has been in force since May 30, 1865, was denounced today by Great Britain and ceases to operate a year hence.

The Reichstag says that the supplementary conventions which were concluded when the treaty was extended to the German states joining the Zollverein, will expire with the main treaty next autumn. With reference to the denunciation of the German commercial treaty, the Times this morning again compliments Canada and Sir Wilfrid Laurier, the Canadian Premier, upon paving the way for further consideration of the European and overseas trade.

The Standard expresses views and says: It would be to the interest of both Germany and Belgium to meet us in a business-like spirit for the negotiation of fresh treaties. The Daily News calls it the first fruits of the peace, and has increased very little in the past forty years. Even if Germany should retaliate by increasing her duties, Great Britain must regard it as a moderate price to pay for the advantages promised from the movement.

Another Result of the Jubilee Colonial Conference.
LONDON, Aug. 2.—In army circles the announcement made by Right Hon. W. Broderick, Parliamentary Secretary to the War Office, that there should be an interchange of troops of the empire, and that some of the colonial battalions should do duty in England, the British regulars taking their places in the colonies, has created the greatest interest, and more details are eagerly looked for.

COLLISION AT NIAGARA FALLS.
Two Electric Passenger Trains Collide on the Gorge Road.
NIAGARA FALLS, Ont., Aug. 3.—A serious accident took place on the Gorge Road, on the American side, at 4.30 o'clock this afternoon at Drinker's Point, near the Devil's Hotel, midway between Suspension Bridge and Lewiston, in which several persons were injured and badly shaken up.
