A LETTER OF COLUMBUS.

W. S. In this box were found a portrait of a beautiful woman painted on ivory, a medallion dates 1497, on which was a raised figure of Christopher Columbus and a roll of parchment covered with writing. Zimmerman, who is a linguist, soon saw that the parchment was a letter from Columbus to Sebastian Velasquez, and related to an expedition which the latter was to lead from Cuba to explore the coasts of Florida.
