Prohibition will not interfere with the keeping of a good hotel. It will close up those places which depend for existence upon debauching their guests. But any man whose hospitality is a public want will find as much legal convenience under Prohibition as under license.

Prohibition will not interfere with any of the business of good work. It will promote everything that is well to maintain in the community, and will enhance public morals. On the other hand it will prohibit drinking and carousing, prevent crime and almost abolish poverty.

Prohibition will not interfere with anything that God has designed for the benefit of mankind. It will prove a great help and no hindrance in doing His work. It will bless us with sober minds, clear heads and industrious lives. It will help us to do His will.—Royal Templar.

WHY LATIN IS USED BY PHYSICIANS.

"Don't see," said the man leaning on the drug-store counter, "why a doctor don't write his prescriptions in English, instead of in Latin."

The druggist said, "You think, I suppose that the doctor writes his prescriptions in Latin so it can't be read so easily—so the laymen can't steal his trade and learn what he is giving him. But that's all wrong. In the first place, Latin is a more exact and concise language than English, and being a dead language does not change, as all living languages do.

Then again, since a very large part of all the drugs in use are botanical, they have in the pharmacopoeia the same names that they have in botany—the scientific names. Two-thirds of such drugs haven't any English names, and so couldn't be written in English.

But suppose a doctor did write a prescription for an uneducated patient. The patient reads it, and then tries to get it filled from memory the second time. Suppose for instance, it calls for iodide of potassium and he gets confused with cyanide of potassium. He could safely take ten grains of the first, but one grain of the second would kill him as dead as a nail.

What an exaggerated claim that it will serve as an illustration. Don't you see how the Latin is a protection and a safeguard to the patient? Prescriptions in Latin he can't read and consequently doesn't try to remember.

Now for a final reason. Latin is a language that is used by scientists now the world over, and no other language. You can get Latin prescriptions filled in any country on the face of the earth where there is a drug-store. We had a prescription come here the other day which was originally, and which had since been tampered by druggists in London, Paris, Berlin, Constantinople, Cairo and Calcutta. What good would an English prescription be in St. Petersburg?
