All the restriction Prohibitio will lay on will be that the use of alcoholic drinks will not be allowed at regular drink ing places or in an idle and dissipated pound is a life-saver and a discuse banisher.

Brohibition will not interfere with the sale of the product of either field, tree or vine, until such time as by process of fermentation or distillation such product has become alcoholic, and consequently dangerous. New older and unfermented wine may be freely sold under Prohibition. Not only this: prohibiting the sale of strong drink should tend to make far greater demand for harmless beverages. Prohibition will not interfere with the keeping of a good hotel. It will close up those places which depend for existence upon debauching their guests. But any man whose hostelry is a public want will find as much legal countenance under
