At the close of the after dinner speeches Mr. Johnson complimented the Council upon their dispatch in the installation of the new electric lighting plant, and stated that if the contracts had been let until the present for closing the plant, now in operation here would have cost the town at least \$1,000 more. This was owing to the large advance in the prices of copper wire and of electrical machinery and apparatus generally since the first of December.
