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BEATS THE LETTER CHAINS.

The latest and most ingenious collection scheme, somewhat after the plan of the endless chain, has been brought out in Indiana by a couple of local churches, both of whom are working toward the erection of \$25,000 auditoriums.

"They call it 'endless chain.'" It is started by one person in each week, who assumes the title of the year and pays \$3 and selects twelve others for the months whose pay \$1 and find four people who each pay \$3 each until at the end of the month.
