fine half a pint of dried apples; cover with half a pint of cold water and let them soak over night. The next morning add a cupful of golden syrsp; simmer gently for one hour. Stand aside to cool. Beat half a cupful of butter to cream ; add one cupful of grapulated sugar. Dissolve a teaspoonful of sods in two teaspoonfuls of water and add it to half a cupful of buttermilk or sour milk ; add two teaspoonfuls of cloves and one egg well beaten. Bift two cupfuls of flour; add a little flour, a little of dried apple mixture and a little more flour until you have the whole well mixed The batter must be the thickness of ordinary cake batter.
