#### EDITORIAL NOTES

Mayor Howard, Toronto, has suggested that it would be a good idea to call a conference of the municipalities of the county for the purpose of discussing and taking steps to protect themselves against water supply and telephone companies and other powerful influences.

The meeting of the House of Commons and the Ontario Legislature have attracted attention to the large number of applications for the incorporation of water supply and telephone companies and other powerful influences.

Mr. Robinson, M. P., of "High," has given notice of a resolution disapproving the practice by railway companies of giving passes to members of Parliament and of the Legislature. He desires that a law be passed to compel railway companies who have received a Federal or Provincial subsidy, to carry all members and Legislators free, and that the mileage of members be abolished.

Many people think our National Anthem was composed for the reign of Queen Victoria, but it was composed, both words and music, by Henry Chichester, an English poet and composer, who died in 1743, substantially as we have it today. It was composed to be sung at one of the birthday celebrations of George II, and was first published in 1745. It was changed to "God Save the Queen," on the accession of Victoria, and is now only changed back to its original form.

The reply to the speech from the throne made to the House of Commons last week by Mr. Hugh Guthrie, M. P., for South Wellington, is referred to on all sides as a very able and highly creditable effort. The interesting part of the speech was that twenty-four years ago Mr. Guthrie's father, Donald Guthrie, of Guelph, had performed the same task. Young Guthrie is the clever son of a clever sire. His father was an able politician and would soon have secured a place in the cabinet had it not been that he suffered from deafness. He was in the gallery when his son made his address and must have been pleased with the applause that greeted the speech, as well as the compliments paid by his leader.

Canada has been and is the home of fiercer families than any other. The late Hart A. Anthony White, of the Ontario Green Lumber Department, in an interview with a Toronto *Trillium* representative, at Toronto, the other day, gave some interesting information regarding the policy of the Ontario Government in prohibiting the export of logs. "These mills have removed their sawmills from Michigan to Ontario, in consequence of which large new mills have been erected in Ontario since April, 1898, when the policy was first enforced, and three firms which had mills in Michigan of the line have greatly enlarged their facilities in Ontario.
