The assignment of the case should have been as follows—South Ontario and West Durham, to the King's Bench Division; North Wellington, to the Common Pleas Division; East Ontario, Ottawa and Cornwall, to the Chancery Division.

A very large expansion of revenue from fees reported by the Provincial Secretary's department. The report for 1902 just issued shows a revenue last year of \$76,077, compared with \$67,861 in 1901, and \$28,200 in 1900. A statement prepared yesterday shows that the increase is continuing for the first five months of this year, and that the revenue for the first five months of 1903, compared with the same period last year, is a gain of 34 per cent. This is the largest in the records of the department, and is an evidence of the continued prosperity of Ontario, and of the large amount of outside capital being invested here in business enterprises.

One of the most remarkable but least noticed facts in connection with the war in the Transvaal is the increase of the value of a large part of General De Wet's army. When hostilities broke out almost every grown man enlisted, even the enfeebled, but the pace has been too rapid for the reasonable bourgeois. As they were killed or incapacitated their places have gradually been taken by mere school-children, many only thirteen or fourteen years of age. Under the title of "The Youngest Soldiers in the World," in the June Cosmopolitan, Allan Baugher throws more light on the make-up and life of General De Wet's command than anything hitherto published.

The Dominion of Canada has granted \$88,884,557 and \$9,722,130 acres of land to railways. The Canadian Pacific has received 25,000,000 acres of land, and \$62,742,010, the remainder being divided among various other railways. In addition to what the Dominion has done for railways, the various Provinces have granted \$21,010,170, and the municipalities \$15,884,548, making a grand total of \$156,077,269 of public money paid in subsidies to railways who are privately owned and controlled. That ought to be pretty near enough money and land to give away for railways on the old basis. Whatever was granted may be made, should be made with a view to ultimate ownership by the State, the subsidies being on the purchase price when the time to pay arrives, or the money being a loan—possibly without interest for a given period—but in the end either recoverable or interest-bearing—Star.
