**EDITORIAL NOTES.**

At the instance of the Registrar General a number of Informal Marriage Licenses have been issued to persons who, it is alleged, are responsible for the registration of certain births and marriages and who have failed to do so.

Woodstock's experience with the Woodstock Wagon Company, which threatens to move to another town because of special favors granted to new industries, has a lesson to be learned for every municipality which has the bones habit.

The one circulation in Canada continues to expand with the increased business requirements of the country for money. The total amount of circulation in circulation on the month of \$50,470,000, an increase of \$1,114,000. The total on October 31st, 1900, was \$28,118,000.

Ontario farmers appear to be holding their wheat. The offerings are light and the market is being difficult in getting the grain at a price profitable for milling. The Privy Council judgment in the Manitoba liquor case given last Friday is a triumph for the Province, their Lordships declaring that the Legislature has jurisdiction to enact a law. The Manitoba prohibition law, introduced by Hon. Hugh John Macdonald, stands on all fours with the provisions for other territories within or manufacturing purposes. It allows importation and sale, but prohibits manufacture and sale in the province, with no importation to be made in less than wholesale lots. The law will probably be proclaimed at once, to take effect at the end of the thirteenth year, May 30.

In view of the declaration by the Privy Council, that the Manitoba prohibition law is constitutional, the Government has decided to amend the law. The amendment will be introduced by Hon. G. F. Meagher, Minister of the Interior, and will provide for a professional second class teacher for the second department at a salary of \$500.

Upon motion of Dr. McKenna and H. Grisdall, the teachers were engaged for 1903 as follows: T. T. Moore, principal, \$600; Margaret Moore, first dept., \$25; Nellie Allen, primary dept., \$25.

At a meeting on Tuesday evening, the Committee on Finance presented their report and recommended payment of the following accounts: A. H. Moore, for oil and cartage, \$11.10; H. V. Moore, expenses, \$1.00; D. Robertson, County Registrar, \$1.00; Committee's expenses, \$22.15.

Moved by J. H. Matthews, seconded by H. Grisdall, that the report of the Committee on Finance be adopted.

Moved by Dr. McKenna, seconded by H. Grisdall, that the chairman and secretary be instructed to negotiate a loan of \$500 for a term of three years, with privilege of prepayment, at a rate of interest not exceeding 4 per cent, and to pay the same by monthly installments.

The Board adjourned to meet at the call of the chairman.

The following letter from our boys at present on the staff, who left Acton last March to join the 10th North African Constabulary, will be read with interest:

Dear Mr. Editor, I received the Pass Pass and you can imagine how glad we were to get a sight of the dear old paper. You know I read it every day and I will be very much pleased to get a copy of it. I was more than sorry not to have time to call on you before leaving for the land of the wild.

I will try to give you as good an account as I can of our doings since leaving Canada. Although it differs from our life in Acton we are not having a very exciting time. It has not been our fortune to have any fighting.

After being in the hospital for a few days, the weather was very pleasant, but our quarters were no more luxurious. A great part of the day was taken up in the kitchen, and the food was not very good.

We were started up roughly the same day as we landed and after three days in open trucks through a country as far as we can see anywhere we reached Halifax, where we stayed a month getting our first taste of active service, drilling all day and doing guard duty.
