## ANOTHER LANDMARK COME.

Alexander Mann, Esq., Called Home at the Good Old Age of Eighty-Eight Years.

The remains of one of our oldest and most highly esteemed residents were laid to rest in fairview Cemetery on Tuesday afternoon. One by one the pioneers of this section are being called away, and this time it is Alexander Mann, Esq. After several years of somewhat frail physical health, though strong and vigorous mentally to the last, he entered into eternal rest.

Alexander Mann was "A. Mann" of Glangarry. He was born in the parish of Glangarry, Invernesshire, Scotland, in the year 1814, and in the spring of 1842, with his parents he left the old home in Scotland and came to Canada. His brothers, Peter, Hugh and John arrived with him in Brantford on the 12th September, following. For a few weeks they remained with the late John Mann, Sr., at their home near the creek. The following spring Mr. Mann settled on the farm just west of Acton, which has been the home of himself and family for over fifty years. He cleared the farm and tillered the soil. During all these years Mr. Mann has been one of our most respected residents.

He took as his partner in life Miss McMillan, a sister of Malcolm McMillan, son of Oakville, formerly of Acton. For over forty years they lived happily together, and Mrs. Mann passed to her reward seventeen years ago. One son and two daughters blessed the union. The following survive: Mrs. Duncan McGregor, Neaseburg; Mrs. John McDonald, Acton; Miss Mary, in Hamilton; and Donald, the only son, who lives on the homestead.

Deceased was an ardent and successful farmer, and a regular attendant of the Presbyterian Church. He had peculiar views upon some points of church doctrine and his faith in the holy scriptures and love for his country, personal and political, were very marked. Before passing away he requested Rev. Mr. Macpherson, his pastor, to use that beautiful and comprehensive verse, John 3:16, as the basis of his remarks at the funeral service.

The funeral on Tuesday was attended by a very large concourse of friends and neighbors. The services were conducted by Rev. H. A. Macpherson and W. R. McAlpine, D. D.
