BUDGET NOTES.

The bill to prohibit members of Public School Boards from being elected members of Municipal Councils has passed the committee stage in the Legislature, and will probably become law.

Milton citizens have set an example in reference to the Fire Brigade which others could follow with credit. For many years a banquet has been provided for the members for the splendid services rendered, by the citizens. Who will move along similar lines of action?

The fact that this letter outlines a course of life which the President's public career has notably illustrated gives its publication at this time a unique and striking interest.

The cry for compensation to hotel men in case the proposed prohibition referendum carries, may well be regarded as a forlorn hope from the outset. It is not a reasonable request. Since the "Crooks Act" came into force on about one-half the inns formerly in existence in Ontario have been closed. Why has not compensation been asked for? The truth is that the liquor trade is a "pecuniary business," and as such is outside the range of compensation.

One of the most active members of the Opposition in the House of Commons the present session is Mr. D. Henderson, M. P. for this country. He is the first to present petitions—three, in fact—all relating to railway matters in Halton. One asks that railway companies independently own or cattle injured by reason of defective cars, another advocates better legislation, a third asks for the abolition of railway commissioners. Mr. Henderson has been a standing interlocution point in the legislative chamber and has kept the Government busy some days to keep him in answering his numerous questions.

The Rev. H. D. Chown, of Toronto, made the unique suggestion that if the referendum bill is defeated, it would be equally fair to reverse the arrangement. "If," he says, "Mr. Rossart has the measure the other way around, permitting the liquor party to be compelling them to do the same for the retention of their trade. That would be fair play, as the trade enjoys privileges in the Province which we do not. We are seeking nothing for ourselves. They are, and should have the task of securing a majority in their favor if we must have a referendum, particularly as the bill is presented to the House in redaction of a privilege to the men to be required to secure a majority for the referendum if it is necessary to the retention of their trade."

The Council then adjourned.

The Montreal Star points out that "one of the humours of the liquor situation is that Mr. Richardson is beaten by Dr. A. Haworth, who was formerly his school teacher at Baldwin's Corners, Ontario. No doubt this is not the first time Dr. Haworth has been beaten by Haworth. The pupil missed a great chance of getting even with the teacher."
