Next Tuesday, and Preparations are Afoot For General Rejoicing.

CONORATION CEREMONIES WILL CONSEQUENTLY BE HELD

London, May 10. A dispatch from the Cape of Good Hope, dated May 10, says that peace in South Africa is certain to result from the conference of the Boer leaders to be held at Vereeniging, Transvaal, May 15. It is said, the dispatch continues, that peace will be officially proclaimed on May 25. Preparations are afoot for general rejoicing.

After having met the members in the field and explained to them the British terms, the Boer leaders were to meet at Vereeniging and reach a final decision on the subject of peace.

A dispatch from London, dated May 2, said it was officially asserted that after their conference at Vereeniging the Boer leaders would proceed to Pretoria and announce to Lord Kitchener their decision in regard to the peace terms they were prepared to accept.
