A militia notice has been sent out ordering the 33rd Regiment Lorne Rifles to Camp at Niagara on the 9th June, for 12 days' instruction. All officers and twenty-one men of No. 6 Company, Acton, will parade at the Armory, Acton, at 8 o'clock on the morning of the 9th June. In the meantime drilling will take place in the evenings at the drill shed. A few desirable men are wanted as recruits. The new daily ration scale authorized for the militia will be adopted and the camp outfit will be provided by the inspectorate.
