obstacles. And what are the obstacles?
Why is it that the woman of the
house, especially the woman on the
farm, does when the sun is ashamed
to rise, and works long after the sun

more of the woman they promise to
love and cherish than they do of them-
selves? In some cases; but by most
cases the question never rises in the
man's mind. He never sees his mother
do anything but work, until she died
or went crazy, poor thing; and his
wife—why? of course there are always
exceptions to do in regard to the house-
wife. Some have been very good. Of
course, she has done her share of the
business when it gets too big for him
to handle, but he wouldn't think of
giving his wife more help. Wouldn't
he? Try and see. Perhaps after all,
women themselves are the chief
obstacles in their own way to a square
deal."
