SKETCH OF THE LIFE OF LYDIA E. PINKHAM

This remarkable woman, whose maiden name was Eaton, was born in the town of Acton, Mass., Feb. 19, 1819.

Her father, John Eaton, was a farmer and a member of the church. She was educated in the common schools and at the Acton Academy.

The Pinkhams had no money, and little credit. Their first laboratory was the kitchen, where roots and herbs were weighed and bottled.
