Mr. Donald McDonald, who has been very ill for the past year or so, is very low. Mrs. George Koper, spent several days last week with friends in Shelburne.

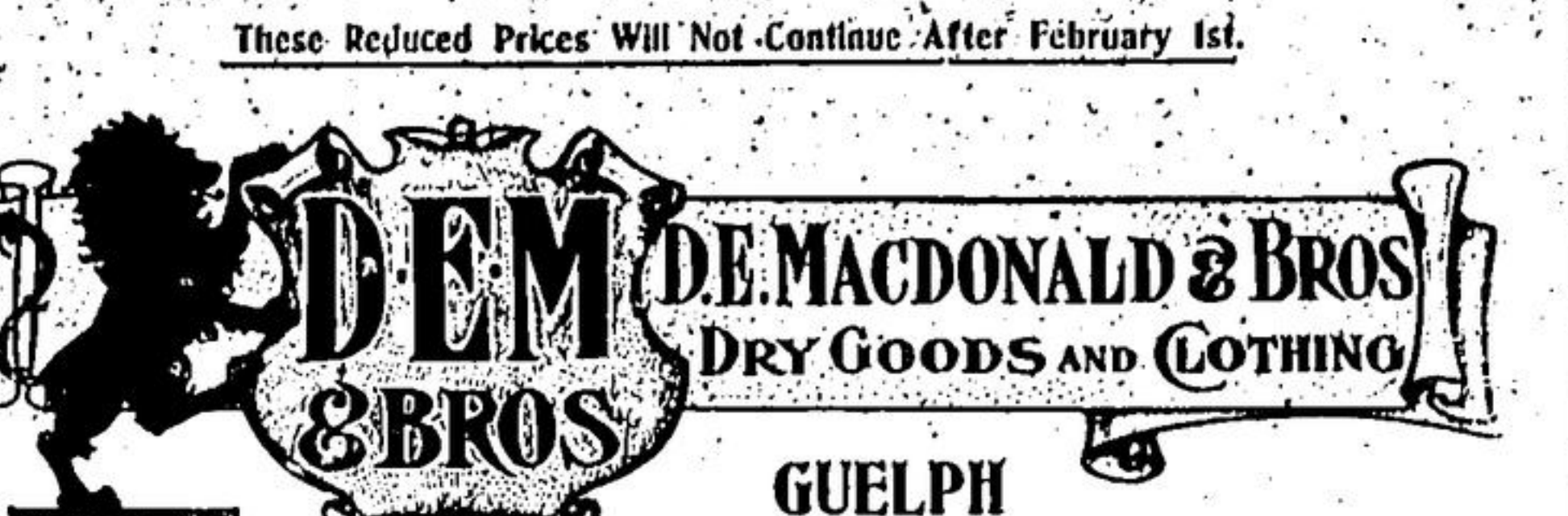
