ANY man who desires to acquire a homestead in the Northwest must first obtain a homestead certificate. This certificate is issued by the Department of the Interior, and is valid for a period of one year. During this period the holder must reside on the land for a certain number of days, and must improve the land in accordance with the regulations.
