SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST HUMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

A NY even numbered acction of Dominion A Lands in Manitoba. Stakatchewan and Alberta, excepting a and 16, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole bead of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the artest of one-quarter section of 160 Application for entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Dominion Lands Agancy or Sub-agency for the district in which the land is situate. Entry by proxy may, however, be made at any Agency on certain conditions by the father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of an intending homesteader. Doring.—(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year for three years.

(2) A homestcader may, it he so desires, perform the required residence duties by living on ferming land owned suicly by him, not less than eighty (16) acros in extent, in the vicinity of his homestead. He may also do so by living with father or mother, on certain conditions. Joint ownership in land will not meet this re-(3) A homestcader intending to perform his residence duties to accordance with the above while living with parents or on farming land owned by himself must notify the Agent for the district of such lutention.
