ACTON HIGH SCHOOL

It must be gratifying to our citizens that success has characterized the Continuation School here from the outset.

The report of Inspector Cowley, who made his semi-annual visit recently, was presented at the meeting of the Board of Education on Monday evening.

The equipment is carefully arranged and in good condition. The work of the third form is a very satisfactory basis, and there has been improvement by the standard of the other forms.

It will be interesting to look critically into the higher education provided at home for our young men and women, especially as it is equal in all respects to what they could secure in any school away from home.

The principal of the Continuation School, and his supervision of its five departments. It would seem fair therefore to charge at least one-half his salary to the Public School.

The entire cost to the municipality therefore, for this splendid privilege of supplying a high school education at home, is \$227.00 per annum.

The Board of Education, with a suitable negligence, had refused or neglected to provide the school privileges our young people now enjoy at home. It would cost the students attending our school to-day an aggregate of between \$200 and \$250 per year for their tuition and board.
