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ANCIENT GUNS

At the siege of Rhodes the Turks constructed mortars by following out cavities in the solid rock at the proper angle, and in the annual of Malta is a trophy of the long and glorious defense of Valetta in a Turkish gun, about a six pounder, composed of a copper tube called over with strong rope and "jacked" with wedges. In the same collection are some antique "quick-firers," breechloaders, with small bore and immensely long barrels, like punt guns. The Huk gunners opposed to England in the two Panghai wars, though they loaded with ammunition, were unable to fire, owing to the rigidity of the barrels, which were fixed from open boxes, stuck to their guns to the last. The blood of the first man killed was splashed on the gun, and the whole detachment died beside it, sooner than retreat.—Chambers' Journal.
