This tract is some 15,000 acros in extent and forms the watershed botween the streams flowing into Lake Ontario directly and those running into the Trent river. The soil is almost pure sand. A fine crop of pine originally covered the area, and after It was taken off, the land was for some years farmed with fair success. the fortility of the soil has steadily diminished and to-day not many farmers are left on the ridge. Many farms have been desorted and areas "hlow" sand have been formed, sand from which is in some cases drifting on and covering up good soll on adjoining farms. The streams throughout the area, too, are torrents spring-time, but in late summer and autumn their beds are almost dry-the usual result of cutting away the for-

este at the headwaters of the streams. Though almost usoloss for farming now, the land will grow fine timber. Originally it was covered with a fine growth of pine, and large stumps still romain to show the size the timber attained. Fine young timber may soon at various places in the area. At one place in Ducham County, moreover, a plantation of young white pine was made some four years ogo and this has developed into a thrifty young crop of timber.




